### course overview

In eighth grade, students study Georgia geography, history, government, and economics. While the four strands are interwoven, ample opportunity is also provided for in-depth study of the geography of Georgia and the government of Georgia. U.S. historical events are included, as appropriate, to ensure students understand Georgia's role in the history of the United States.

### goals

- Understand that history is complex and there are multiple perspectives to unpack when studying history
- Use the Cultural Approach framework to analyze history
- Seek to truly and deeply understand the content
- Develop critical thinking skills
- Become an aware, informed and active global citizen
- Visibly exhibit thinking, learning and understanding
- Strengthen reading comprehension and Lexile level
- Be a clear and communicative writer
- Interpret and analyze primary and secondary sources
- Use of technology inside and outside of the classroom and integration of blended learning
- Pass the Georgia Milestones Assessment System (GMAS) for this course
- Develop an enjoyment of social studies and strive to be a lifelong learner!

- Language, classroom culture and practices will focus on thinking, learning and understanding rather than passively doing work, obtaining knowledge and obsessing over grades. We will engage in documentation of the learning process, reflection of what we've learned, how our thinking has developed over time and multiple opportunities and pathways to show mastery of content, skills and civic principles.
- o Grades are based on **mastery** of state standards. Students will be assessed through formative daily work (40%) and summative tests/ projects (60%). All assignments, quizzes, tests and projects will be graded out of a set number of points. Example: exit ticket= 5 pts.; primary source analysis= 20 pts.

#### • Interactive Student Notebooks (ISNs)

Student documentation of learning will be recorded in a spiral interactive student notebook (ISN). ISNs will serve as a central location to record information and ideas, to provide descriptions and explanations, to make predictions and connections, to consider different perspectives and to form conclusions. The ISN is a combination of teacher-student created textbook and a reflection journal. It is essential to student success in this course.

#### Attendance

- o I enjoy school most when all of my students are present, engaged and learning!
- We will be doing a lot of hands-on activities, group work, and performances of understanding that necessitate students to be in class.
- o If a student is absent, please contact me so I can make accommodations and adaptations so that the student does not fall behind.

#### • Missed Assignments

In the event that a student is absent, students have multiple opportunities to make up missing work. Assignments will be posted on my class website and/or my Canvas page. Students are welcome to come to me before school, after school on Tuesdays or during increased learning time (ILT) with the teacher permission. It is my hope that he/she will also seek ways to fill the gaps in understanding that may have been missed. **That goes beyond simply making up missing work to replace a missing grade.** It requires the student to read, watch videos, do some research, talk with adults and peers so that he/she can truly and deeply learn the content.

#### Projects

- Select 8<sup>th</sup> Grade students will complete a Social Studies Fair Project (more information will be handed out and discussed with students at the end of August).
- Each nine weeks, students will complete an authentic project of their choice regarding topics local/ state geography, history, governments and/or economics.

#### Home Learning (Homework)

- o Each night, work through the unit review modules in Canvas (more info to come, other options available).
- O Students will be inspired to do some learning at home and in the community! I encourage students to engage in social studies as often as possible outside of class. Examples include:
  - Read/ watch the news, exploring multiple sources to consider different viewpoints
  - Tour local and state historical sites and museums
  - Speak with business owners about their impact on the local economy
  - Attend civic gatherings and hear elected official speak
  - Take nature walks and explore the natural geography of our area
  - Notice population patterns and the layout of urban and rural places as you travel
  - Pick your own adventure!
- o If students do not finish assignments and documentation in class, I am asking that they finish their work outside of class in order to continue their thinking and not develop gaps in understanding.
